Priority Recruitment: How it works

At the end of every round, PMs will rank the chapters whose parties they have attended in preferential order. At the same time, the chapters are submitting their selection of PM's to invite back. Each PM's preferences and chapter selections are processed to generate invitations to the next round. An hour before the parties begin for the next round, PMs will pick up their schedule of parties for that day from their Group Leader at the Lod Cook Alumni Center.

On the next page, we have provided a worksheet that has spaces as well as numbered spaces for each round. This is to help keep track of selections throughout the week. After the end of Round 1 (Monday, August 16 at 5:20 pm), PMs will go to Pleasant Hall to make selections. The PMs will have visited all 10 chapters this round. The maximum amount of chapters a PM can attend during round 2 is 7, therefore, leaving 3 alternate chapters. These 3 alternate chapters that were not clustered will be ranked in preferential order, with number 1 being the chapter that a PM would most like to return to after the cluster. This process will continue for Rounds 2 and 3. PMs may only rank chapters that they have attended parties for that round and clustering up to the maximum number that a PM can visit the next round.

What is a Recruitment Violation

The Recruitment process is intended to give each PM an equal opportunity to become familiar with all the sororities composing the LSU Panhellenic Council. In order to keep the process fair for all parties involved, Recruitment guidelines have been established with the expectation that they will be followed. However, violations may occur that include, but are not limited to the following:

- Receiving gifts such as t-shirts, sorority presents, etc. from a sorority member or alumnae
- Receiving invitations to events such as teas, dinners, etc. during the spring or summer (excluding events sponsored by the Panhellenic Council)
- Having more than two actives speak with you in a room alone during Recruitment week
- Receiving a promise of a future bid from a sorority or its members
- Receiving contact such as phone calls, text messages, etc. from a sorority member that you did not have a relationship with prior to Recruitment

If you experience any of the above violations, you are being treated unfairly or feeling uncomfortable as a potential member by the sorority. This special treatment may seem as though the sorority is guaranteeing you membership into their chapter. However, the Recruitment process holds no guarantees for anyone. Please see the next page on how to report a Recruitment violation.

Recruitment Rule Violations: What to do

If for any reason, you feel that you have witnessed or become part of a Recruitment rule violation, it is highly encouraged and respected if you file against the circumstance with Panhellenic. By doing this, you are helping Panhellenic and the Greek Community at LSU by promoting fair, ethical behavior. Recruitment violations unfortunately happen, it's up to you to help prevent them. If for any reason you need to file a report, or simply discuss the situation with someone, here's what you do:

1. Be a good detective. Do your best to gain specific details of the situation. Try to get names, exact wording, and setting.
2. Don't spill the beans to everyone. Tell only someone that can help solve the problem or prevent further similar circumstances. Tell your Gamma Chi, the Panhellenic office, any Panhellenic Executive officer, or email lsurecruitment@hotmail.com (the VP of Recruitment).
3. Don't think that you'll be considered a tattler. Be confident that you did the right thing. You have helped prevent future unethical behavior.

**This hotline allows you to tell what happened or what you heard even if you don't have all of the information directly. You can choose to remain anonymous if you wish. Simply call and let the answering machine hear your story.*

Rules for Active Sorority Members concerning you, the Potential Member:

1. Active members cannot invite you to chapter-sponsored events where alcohol is present (ex: grubs, formals, crawfish boils, etc.) You may be invited to attend overall Greek events by Panhellenic (ex: Songfest).
2. During the summer and the Recruitment week, inappropriate contact between actives and potential members shall be prohibited. Inappropriate contact shall be defined as, but not limited to actives participating in any of the following:
 - Transportation to and from bars,
 - Providing and/or purchasing alcohol,
 - Contacting PMs whom they do not have a prior relationship with, (for instance, if you don't know each other well enough to have their phone number in your cell phone)
 - Specifically promoting your sorority or speaking negatively about other sororities at LSU, or
 - Organizing gatherings, events, and/or events for the purpose of chapter members to meet PMs.
2. No flowers or gifts may be sent to you, the potential member, from collegiate members, alumnae, collegiate members from other chapters, and mothers of collegiate members and new members.
3. Only Panhellenic publications and/or invitations can be mailed to you, a potential member. Individual sorority publications may not be sent to potential members.
4. Silence will go into effect August 8th until the distribution of bids. All social contact, to include phone calls, emails, letters, and text messaging, between potential members and active members of sororities must cease (mothers/sisters/boyfriends are also not allowed to be in contact with actives.)

5. There shall never be more than TWO sorority women recruiting a potential member during a party at the same time. There shall never be one on one contact between a PM and an active behind closed doors. Chapter members are not allowed to use any language that might give insight into a further invitation. For instance, they cannot say: "We/I hope to see you tomorrow!" and/or "You'll definitely get a bid from us."
6. No sorority may refer to any other sorority negatively during any party or question you, the potential member, about your event schedule.
7. Sororities are not allowed to keep you in their house beyond the allotted time of the party.
8. You, the potential member, are not allowed to bring any items received in the house with you when leaving the party (including napkins, drinks, flowers, notes, etc.)

Rules that Potential Members must abide by:

1. A PM must be a regularly matriculated (pursuing a degree), full-time student to be eligible for participation in recruitment. Visiting students cannot be pledged by any of the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) sororities.
2. A PM shall not be, or ever have been, an initiated member of a NPC group. If in doubt, please contact Panhellenic.
3. A PM shall not have been a new member to an NPC group, within one calendar year, at the same school where she is a potential member.
4. From August 1, 2010 through the accepting of bids, no PM shall visit a sorority house except for events approved.

5. All PMs must attend convocation, all meetings with Recruitment Counselors, all events, and the maximum number of invitational socials throughout Recruitment week. Failure to do so will result in the removal of the PM from further Recruitment activities. In the event of illness, emergency or University scheduled event such as band, cheerleading, Golden Girl, or athletic teams, the PM shall notify Panhellenic and/or her Recruitment Counselor, who will notify the chapters involved.
6. Refund Policy:
 - NO REFUND for withdrawals after August 5, 2010 (unless authorized by the VP of Recruitment).
 - Registration Refund of \$125: If PM has a death in family, severe illness, or other extenuating circumstances reviewed by VP of Recruitment AT ANY TIME (ends on Saturday morning, August 21, 2010).
7. PMs are expected to be on time for all meetings and events.
8. PMs must provide their own transportation to and from all events. (All chapters are within walking distance on campus.)
9. PMs must not walk behind sorority houses during events.
10. PMs must not park at the Lod Cook Alumni Conference Center or hotel, Systems Building or the behind the sororities houses.
11. Each round, PMs are advised to maximize their opinions by accepting invitations for that maximum amount for the next round.

12. PMs must wear a Panhellenic nametag during events. (\$5.00 for each official Panhellenic new nametag replacement, and \$10 for t-shirt size change.)
13. PMs must make their preferential selections immediately after the last event she attends. There shall be strict silence between PMs, their mothers/sisters, and with active sorority members, in observance from the time she leaves the last house until she receives her bid. PMs may consult a Recruitment Counselor at this time. Once the preferences are made, no changes may be made. By submitting:
 - a. The PM is willing to accept an invitation to membership from any women's fraternity that PM lists on the agreement.
 - b. The PM may limit choices to one or list the maximum amount of choices in which that PM has attended a preference event and is willing to accept membership.
 - c. The PM cannot change the order of her preferences or add or delete a preference once this agreement has been submitted to the College Panhellenic Association.
 - d. Once the PM confirms this agreement, she is bound by the National Panhellenic Conference calendar year rule. This rule states that if a PM receives an invitation to membership from any group the PM has listed and the PM chooses not to accept it, the PM is ineligible to be pledged to any other inter/national fraternity on this campus for one calendar year.
 - e. If the PM does not receive an invitation to membership from a group that she has listed, the PM is eligible for continuous open bidding among chapters that are eligible to participate.

14. A PM must consult her Recruitment Counselor before withdrawing from Recruitment. In the event that the PM feels she must withdraw, she must go to the Panhellenic office and complete the official withdraw form or contact her Recruitment Counselor.
15. PMs may have no contact with actives beginning August 1, 2010 through Bid Day.
16. The PM and sororities must honor all invitations to Recruitment functions. In case of illness or other emergency, Panhellenic will notify the chapter with an official excuse. Panhellenic Executive board shall establish procedures and protocols for PMs positively diagnosed with H₁N₁ or any other highly contagious illness.

Rules That Your Gamma Chi Must Abide By:

1. Gamma Chi's are not allowed to promote any sorority over the other. In addition, they are not allowed to announce their own sorority to any PM.
2. Gamma Chi's are not allowed to facilitate or allow any games or debates by PMs about what sorority PMs believe them to be in. There shall be no "guessing games."
3. A Gamma Chi must follow the Gamma Chi Code of Ethics and do the best job possible to aid PMs in experiencing a positive Recruitment process.

Meal Plans

All students living on campus must have an LSU meal plan. Housed sororities offer new members the opportunity to eat meals at the house. Each new member is responsible for completing the proper paperwork provided by Tiger Card Office within the second week of school indicating their desire to alter their original LSU meal plan. The procedure will be communicated September 8, 2010 at 6:00 pm at the Cox Communication Auditorium at the New Member symposium. It is important to note that a sorority may not require a new member to eat all meals at the house, unless this expectation is communicated during the Recruitment process.

GPA Information

Upon admission to LSU, the Office of Admissions evaluates your core grades and assigns you your GPA using LSU's standards. This GPA is the GPA our 10 sororities will be using. Grades are an important factor in sorority membership.
